When there is time to spare she enjoys reading fantasy novels and adventuring outdoors: skiing, kayaking, hiking, and camping. She also works on her own ancient-inspired sculp-tures and searches for opportunities to exhibit her works. She was recently a resident at New Harmony Clay Project for 3 months in New Harmony, Indiana, where she got the chance to take a break from the daily grind and focus on new sculptural ideas. 




